On the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Sexual Violence in Conflict in 2022 (19th of June), the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) will be supporting the collaboration between Swiss artist and psychotherapist, Franziska Greber, and the Red Cross Museum with an exhibition centered on the issue of Sexual Violence in Conflict: its negative impacts, the experiences and voices of survivors and ultimately calling for its prevention and eradication.

Franziska Greber has spent the last four decades devoting herself to projects related to domestic and other forms of violence, gender equality, and legal issues, having worked extensively with survivors of domestic and gender-based violence.

The Red Cross Museum has confirmed the availability of their FOCUS Space for the month of June 2022 for Franziska's work.

The exhibition concept also entails public works that include uprooted (dead) trees – see concept note attached.

Presently, Franziska Greber call for supports to collaborate on this exhibition, including financial or other in-kind contributions for the realization of this work, as well as authorization to display her art in public space.

Knowing the quality and impact of Franziska Greber's work and her strong commitment in the fight for the elimination of sexual violence, I support her call.
